Photographs:

Pick up Points:

There will be two pick up for the coach transporting members to London Heathrow on Friday 17th July 2009. There are:-

Fulwell Methodist Church at 08.00 and Showcase Cinema, Teesside Park, Stockton at 09.30

We are assuming that all members from Durham and Northumberland will be picked up at Fulwell and the Cleveland members at Teesside Park. If this is not the case please let Barbara know before 15th July 2009. Please do not be late as we have to be at Heathrow in plenty of time for our check in.

Publicity:

The main party is almost certainly being met at the airport in Lusaka by Zambia Scouts and it is important that all members arrive in Lusaka wearing full complete uniform which includes navy trousers for all and a belt for the Scouts. It is also likely that young members will be interviewed by television and radio crews

Medical:

Several members have indicated that they will be taking medication while in Zambia but they have not supplied details of this medication to Doreen as requested. If you have not been in touch with Doreen please let her know your details as soon as possible. As mentioned in the last newsletter if you are taking a prescription drug Doreen will keep a three day supply for you as long as it is given to her in a clearly marked container. This supply can then be used in an emergency until a further supply can be located and obtained.

It is important that you take your malaria tablets as prescribe and to help members remember to take them it has been suggested that we all take our pills in the morning.
